Children's interests

Ourselves Autumn Term



Following home visits to each of the children we continue to follow individual interest in school as children settle into their new environment.

We help the children express who they are, share all about their families and home community as they become settled in their new setting.

As well as helping your child to settle we welcome parents and families to become part of our school community.

We allocate key workers to each child and set up Learning Journeys as a vibrant record of your child's interests and achievements throughout the year.

Fairy Stories Spring Term



We will begin the term listening to well-known fairy tales, *The Three Little Pigs* and *Goldilocks* and the *Three Bears*.

We use props to help us retell the stories to our friends and see if we can learn the repeated refrains.

We then link the story *Jack and the Beanstalk* with growing plants from seed.

We become super scientists and grow butter beans in soil and cress on cotton wool and find out about how plants grow.

All creatures great and small Summer Term



We will learn about minibeasts and exploring the Nursery grounds looking for ladybirds, spiders, worms and caterpillars. We will end our topic with a visit to Richmond Park.

We enjoy a visit from Miller's Ark Animals. There will be sheep and lambs to cuddle, naughty goats and kids, piglets to tickle and a miniature donkey or pony to groom!

We will invite the children to bring in a pack lunch and practise eating in the small hall within the school. We will visit our new classes and our new teachers will be visiting the Nursery to read stories.
